About 20 percent of 2010 bankruptcy filers held a bachelor's degree or higher, up from 16 percent four years earlier. About 36 percent of filers have a high school education level, while another 29 percent have some college education.

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The largest percentage decrease was a 16 percent reduction in the District of Wyoming. The largest numeric decline was a drop of 2,995 filings in the District of New Jersey. The highest percentage increase was a rise of 11 percent in the Northern District of Iowa. Fewer petitions were filed under chapter 13 of the bankruptcy code.

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
